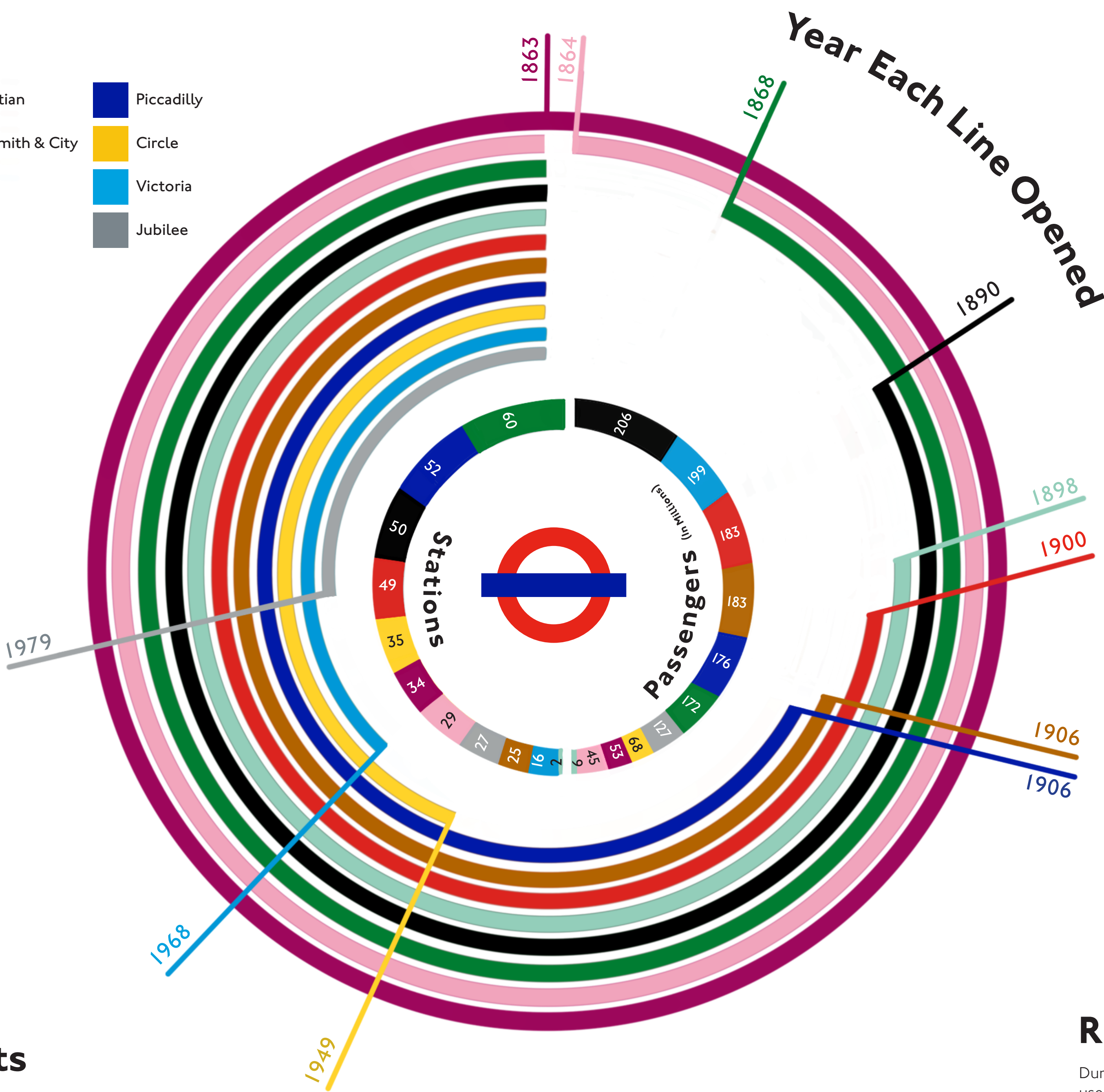

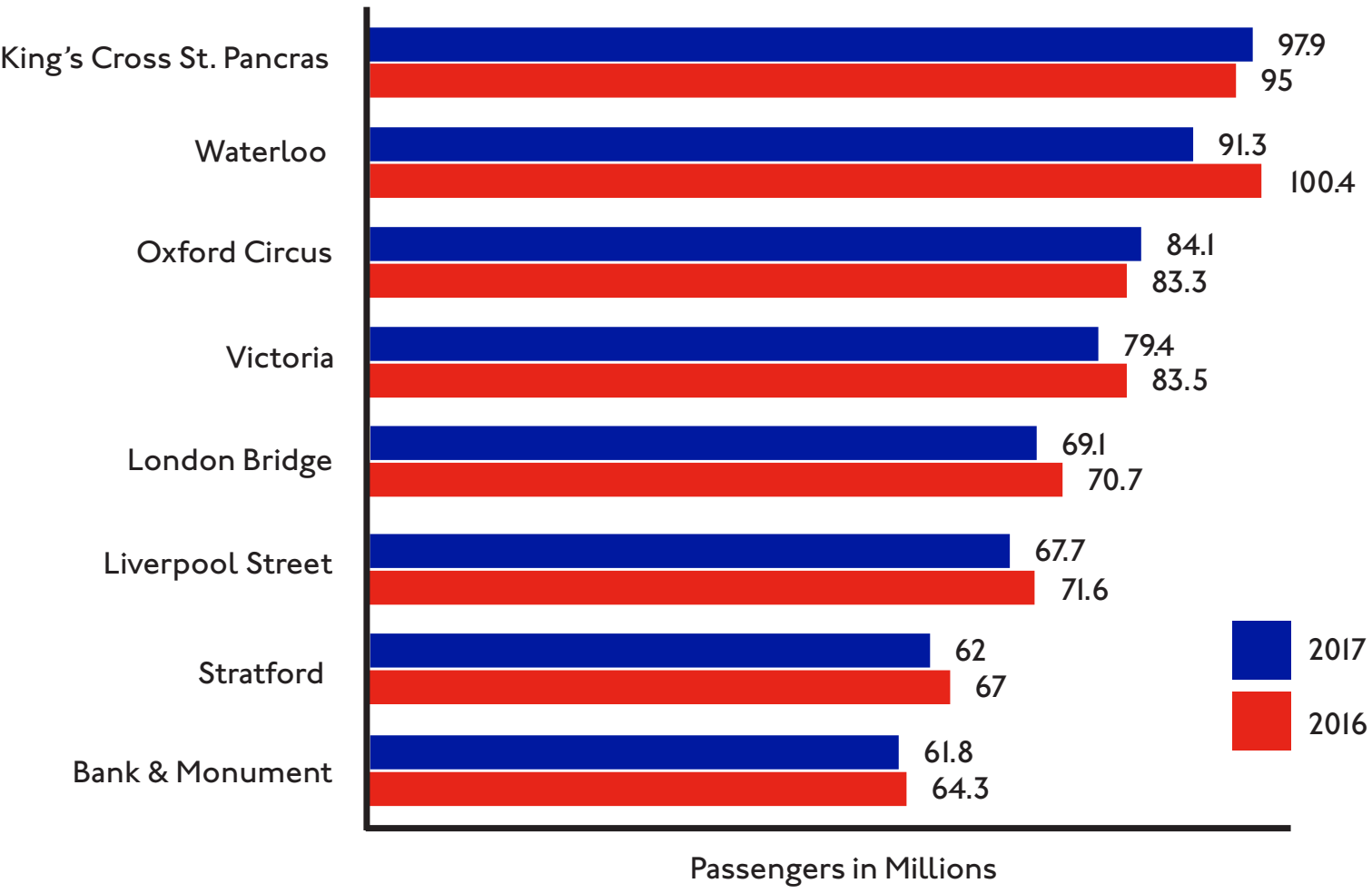

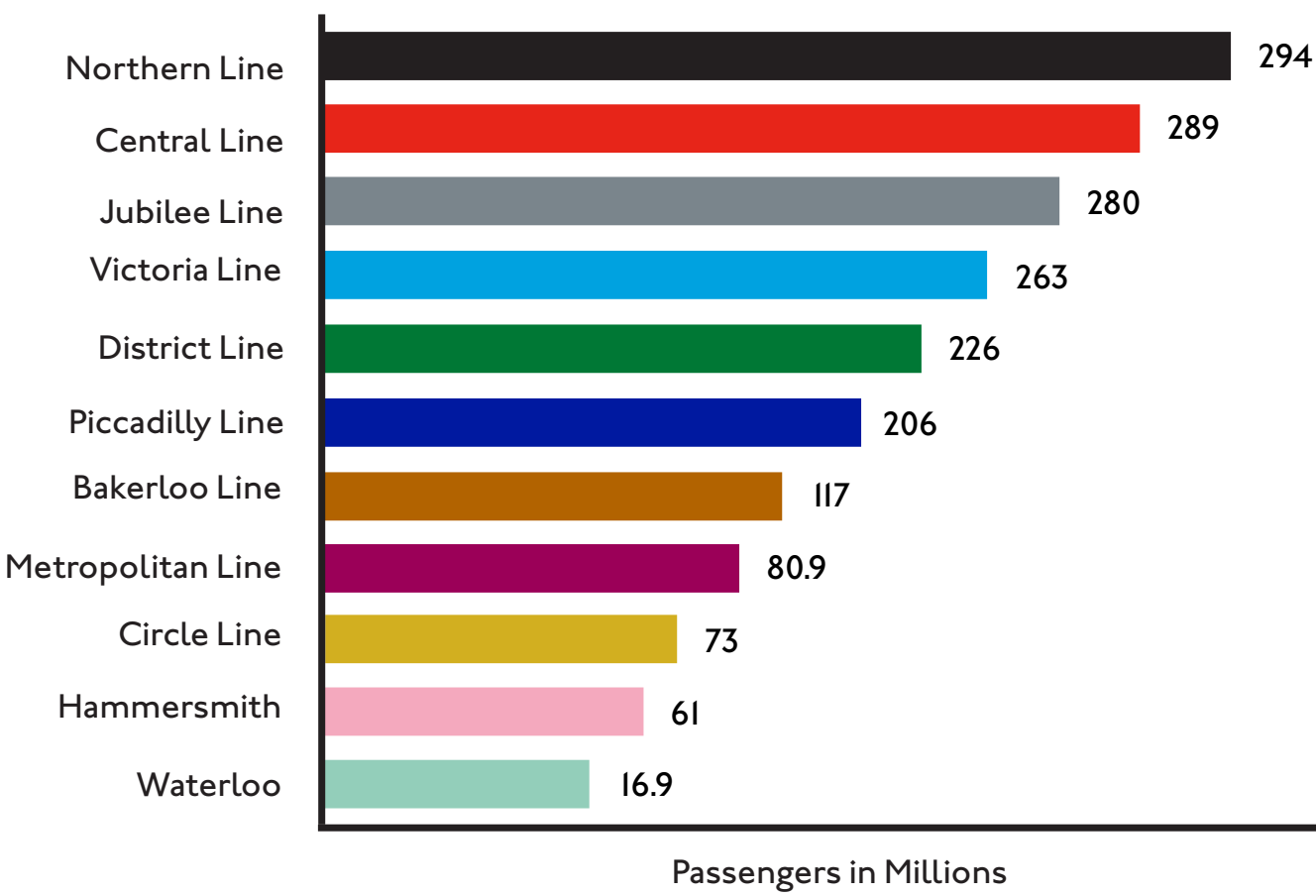

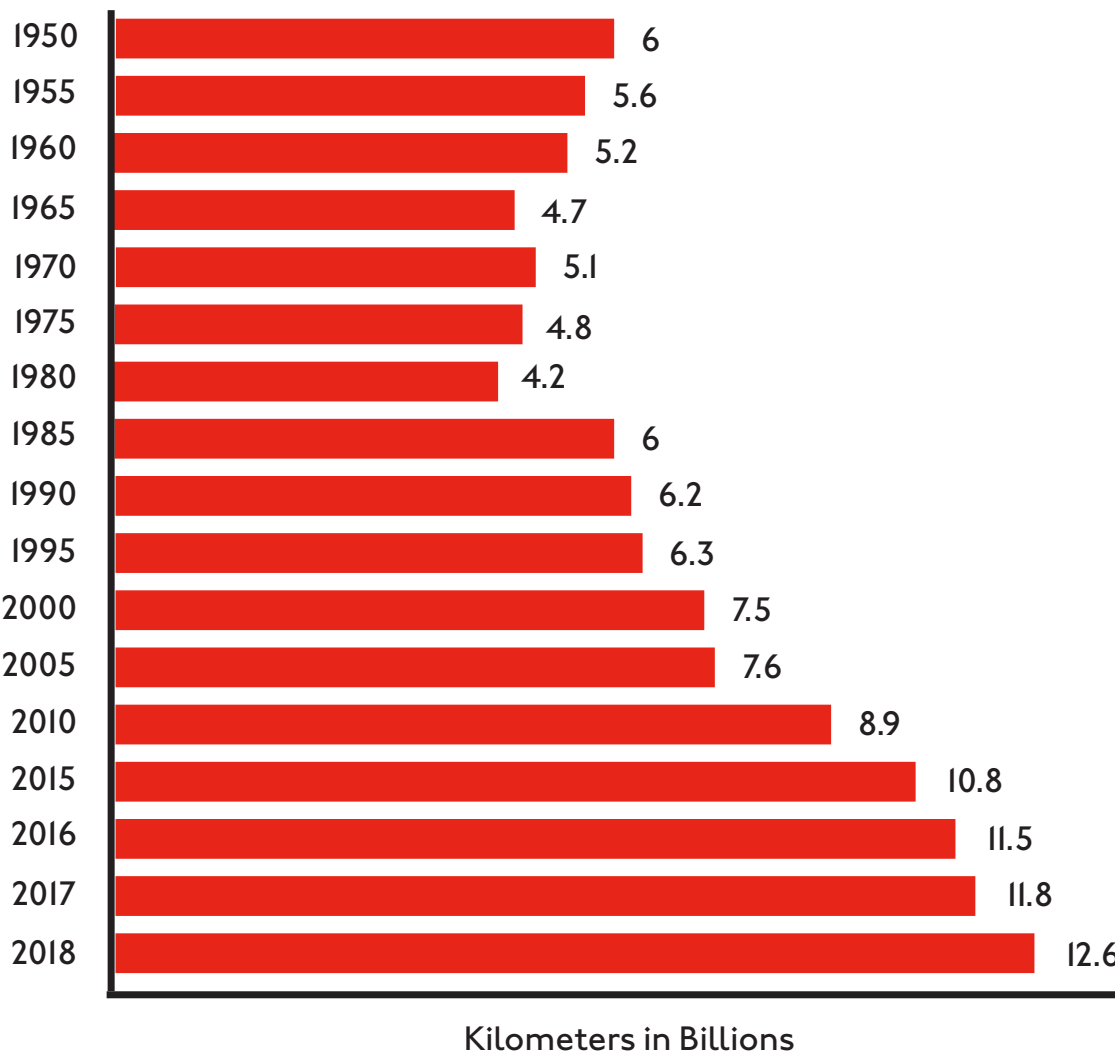
Busiest London Underground Stations By

Between The Years 1950 – 2018



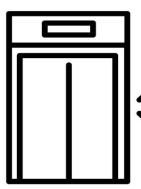
